About the District...

The Lower Platte South Natural Resources District is one of 23 districts in the state of Nebraska, formed in 1972 for the purpose of managing the state's natural resources. Programs and activities include all areas of natural resource management and development: tree planting, flood protection, wildlife habitat, streambank stabilization, environmental education, land treatment, water monitoring and many others. The districts are partially funded by property taxes and are governed by a board of directors--elected representatives who serve four-year terms. The NRD system is local government working to protect local natural resources. The Lower Platte South NRD includes nearly all of Lancaster and Cass counties and parts of Seward, Saunders, Otoe and Butler counties.

Purpose

The Lower Platte South NRD has established a Community Forestry Program for the purpose of cost-sharing on the total cost of tree plantings by community groups.

Who's Eligible?

Neighborhood associations, service organizations, citizen groups, business associations, villages, cities, schools, churches and clubs are all eligible for the cost-share program. Eligible lands include non-federal and non-state public lands and private property within the corporate limits of a city or village. No projects will be eligible for cost-share funds when planting under overhead power or utility lines.



Terms

1. Minimum number of trees per application is ten.
2. Shrubs are not eligible for cost-share assistance.
3. Standard stock sizes are 1 1/2"-1 3/4" on deciduous trees and 4'-5' on conifer stock.
4. Smaller stock sizes will not be eligible for funds.
5. Larger stock can be planted but cost-share will be based on the price of the standard size stock.
6. Maximum in-kind claim amount is \$50/tree for planting and/or \$10 per tree for three years of watering and mulching.
7. Proposals from at least two tree vendors must accompany each application.
8. All trees must be guaranteed for one year.

Cost-Share Rate

The District cost-share rate is up to 50% of the total cost of the trees, planting and care with the District's share not to exceed \$10,000 per application.

The applicant's match must be a minimum of 25% cash (private funds, no tax funds) and up to 25% other program funds or grants including non-NRD tax dollars, or in-kind services for planting and tree care.

Application Deadline

Application deadline is February 1st. Program applications will be reviewed and are subject to approval by the NRD Board of Directors.

Applicants will be informed of the Board's actions prior to March 1st.

All projects should be completed before June 1st.
