### LPSNRD Board Adopts Tentative Budget

Lincoln (NE) July 22, 2021 – The Lower Platte South Natural Resources District (LPSNRD) Board of Directors tentatively approved a Fiscal Year 2022 Budget at its regular monthly meeting on July 21st. The \$33.8 million balanced plan for revenue and expenditures will have a public hearing Wednesday, August 18th and public comments will also be welcomed when the budget receives final consideration during the next regular meeting of the Board, on August 26<sup>th</sup>. Both meetings will be held at the LPSNRD office, 3125 Portia Street, in Lincoln, starting at 7:00 PM.

FY 2022 Tentative Budget highlights include:

- Antelope Creek streambank repairs, 40th St. to Scott Ave. (\$2.3M)
- Surface Water Quality cost-sharing assistance to landowners (\$1.9M)
- Deadmans Run Flood Reduction Project, 48<sup>th</sup> St. to Cornhusker Hwy (\$1.6M)
- Salt Creek Levees operation & maintenance (\$1.3M)
- Groundwater Management (\$1.1M)
- Homestead Trail bridges, culverts & bank stabilization (\$900K)
- Upper Salt 3-A Watershed Rehabilitation (\$790K)
- Salt Creek Resiliency Study implementation (\$700K)
- Antelope Creek drainage pipe rehabilitation (\$700K)
- Prairie Corridor on Haines Branch (\$650K)
- Community Assistance Programs (\$415K)
