



RAIN-READY LANDSCAPES PROGRAM

The Rain-Ready Landscapes Program (RRLP) helps landowners reduce stormwater runoff and pollution by installing green infrastructure like rain gardens and bioswales. These practices filter pollutants, slow runoff, and reduce erosion and sedimentation in local waterways.

Eligibility

- Rain gardens
- Bioswales
- Other green stormwater-filtering landscape features

Projects must be located outside the City of Lincoln but within the LPSNRD. All property types (residential, commercial, public, private) are eligible.

Note: Lincoln residents can visit lincoln.ne.gov (keyword: "rainscaping") for similar City programs.

Cost-Share Details

- 50% cost-share, up to \$2,000
- Applies to design, materials, and construction
- Maintenance is the landowner's responsibility and not cost-shared
- Applicants may use other funding sources, but NRD only matches the portion paid directly by the landowner, up to \$2,000



How to Apply

- Contact LPSNRD to confirm your project's eligibility
- Submit a request letter with:
 - Project description and design drawings
 - Aerial map and optional photos
 - Scope, cost estimate, and expected timeline
 - Maintenance plan

Projects are reviewed first-come, first-served until annual RRLP funds are depleted.

FAQs

When do I get reimbursed?

After project completion, submit a reimbursement request with proof of payment.

What if my project is delayed?

You have one year from approval to complete the project. Extensions may be granted upon request.
