Subject:	Public Awareness Survey

Every four or five years, since 1982, LPSNRD has surveyed the constituency to learn perceptions about natural resources and LPSNRD efforts. We've also used the survey to track how the public prefers to learn about what we do. On March 21, we launched our first electronic Public Awareness Survey. Due to technology and cell phone use, it is no longer practical to gather our survey data via phone. The survey continued through April 5 and 902 people responded, compared to the 300 calls made during our telephone surveys.

Staff realized the need to go digital with our survey last year, when preparing the current Finance & Planning budget. Up to \$15,000 had been spent on the most recent surveys, but \$10,000 was budgeted for this year's survey, in anticipation that surveying online would be less expensive. It is! Staff expects the total cost to be less than \$5,000.

Staff formulated survey questions, using past surveys and the expertise of Red Thread. Our intent was to continue tracking responses to questions we've asked in surveys for decades and to gather potentially useful data about some of our current activities. Unanimous, which built our website, was instrumental in formatting the survey and presenting it to the public. The survey was promoted through our Facebook and Instagram accounts, on our website and by email. Online ads were placed promoting the survey and were targeted to potential respondents within the district. Red Thread tracked zip codes of respondents during the survey, to make sure the entire district was being represented. It was not necessary, but online advertising could have been adjusted during the survey toward areas of the district not being represented.

As added incentive, ten \$50 Amazon gift cards were given away in a random drawing of respondents who opted to give us their email address.

Red Thread will present an analysis of survey results at this month's board meeting.











IN THE PAST, WHERE HAVE YOU HEARD ABOUT LPSNRD PROGRAMS OR PROJECTS?





HOW WOULD YOU PREFER TO LEARN **ABOUT LPSNRD PROGRAMS & PROJECTS?**








